ANNUAL MEETING

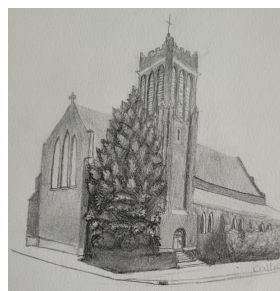
FEBRUARY 12 after service
