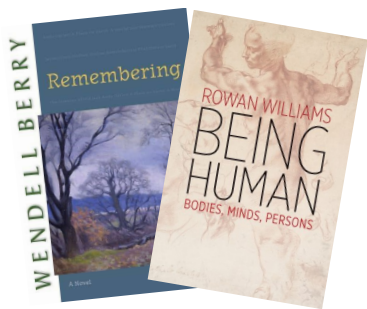

FINANCIAL UPDATE

As you may recall, this year's budget is ambitious. The major change was the decision to expand the Parish Administrator role to full time. Our vestry approved a 2023 budget requesting increased giving and resulting in a deficit to provide time to ramp up to the new need over time.

Here's where we stand after the first quarter:

Note 1: Last year's early giving included gifts from families of parishioners who died.
Note 2: Our insurance bill has not come yet. Indications are that it will be much higher than anticipated. Please pray that God will open a way that we can bear.
