Fr. Cal: Will you dare to embrace each other and grow together in love?

All: **We will.**

Deacon Arleen: Will you dare to share your riches in common and minister to each other in need?

Fr. Cal: Will you dare to pray for each other until your hearts beat with the longings of God?

All: **We will.**

Deacon Arleen: Will you dare to carry the light of Christ into the world's dark places?

All: **We will.**

The Easter Candle is extinguished in silence.

Fr. Cal: The Lord is here.

All: **His Spirit is with us.**

Today we have remembered the coming of God's power on the disciples and we invite that same Spirit to drive us out into the wild places of the world.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

Our giving continues to be beautifully meeting our need. At the end of April, our expenses had outpaced our giving by \$1,900 which is largely because our entire insurance premium was paid in the first quarter of the year. The giving includes a \$5,000 bequest. We're deeply grateful that another \$5,000 bequest was received in May as well as notice for another \$6,500 to be received in the weeks/months ahead.

This puts us in a good position for our current needs.
