Old Testament Trinity, icon by Andrei Rublev

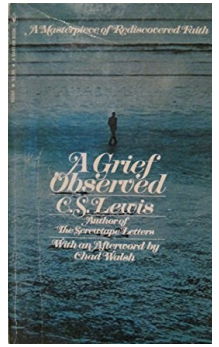

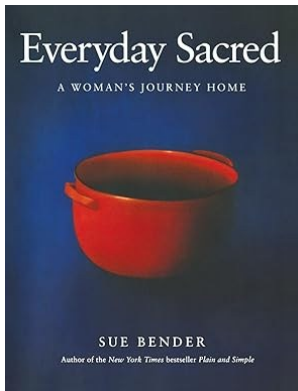
LIBRARY UPDATE – BOOK INTROS

A Grief Observed by C.S.Lewis

After the death of his wife Joy, C.S.Lewis wrote a journal to process his grief (originally under a pseudonym). They had been married for four short years and these years were the happiest of his life and the most transformative. In his characteristic honesty he lays bare the raw anguish of loss and the doubts and rage directed at God, who gave and then so quickly took away. One of Lewis' great gifts was his ability to describe the intimate and indescribable. In his processing of his grief he has been, and continues to be, a companion to many others walking a similar lonely path, where all that once made sense is crumbling, and faith demands a new discovery. Chad Walsh, who was a close friend of Joy Davidman Gresham and C.S.Lewis, writes a sensitive and helpful afterword.



Everyday Sacred - A Woman's Journey Home by Sue Bender



Sue Bender is an artist, a gifted storyteller and a wise woman. In her words, this book emerged out of a “connect-the-dots record of my search for the sacred in everyday life.” She speaks of her search for the big miracle that would change her life and how she found instead that small things are of extreme importance. She says, “Small miracles are all around us. We can find them everywhere – in our homes, in our daily activities, and hardest to see, in ourselves...” An uplifting enjoyable read.
