Fr. Louis and his wife Natasha will be joining us with their children Lottie (2 years old) and Eli (5 months old).

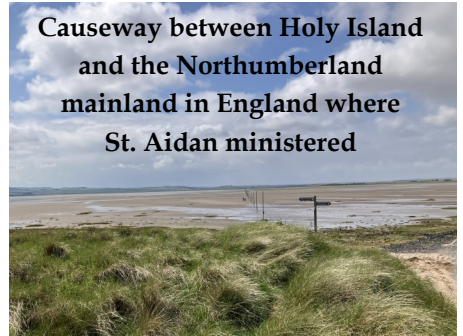

ORDINATION INVITATION — June 27 @ 2PM

You are invited to Nathan and Michelle's ordination service on June 27 in the nave. A reception will follow.

After their ordination as deacons they will fulfill their next requirements. It appears they will complete their diaconal year alternating Sundays at St. Aidan and at St. Paul's Cathedral in Regina — one of them here, the other there most weeks. In addition, they each need to complete a unit of Clinical Psychospiritual Education (CPE) — a 7-month course that requires two days/wk. Our vestry has committed to helping them with finances. The timing of this training has not yet been established. If all goes to plan, ordination to the priesthood is anticipated in about a year. The process to date has not been straightforward, so we bear that in mind as your ongoing prayers are requested.
