


INCUMBENT PRIEST SEARCH UPDATE

SUNDAY MORNINGS WITH NATHAN—Oct 19 - Nov 9 at 9AM




Have you ever asked: what is the Bible? why do we read it? where did it come from? is it relevant today? is it inerrant or inspired? does it matter?

The Hawk and the Dove series by Penelope Wilcock. (Books 1-5 of 9 in series) — teen and adult fiction. The story is centered around the fictional Benedictine monastery of St. Alcuin's in Yorkshire, set in the 14th century.

A very engaging and beautifully told story, with themes that draw us in – resentment and forgiveness, grief and trauma, comparison and jealousy, living with difficult

people, forbidden longings, to name a few. You will laugh, cry and be deeply moved as you get caught up in the life of St Alcuin. Penelope Wilcock's skill as a storyteller avoids sentimentality or preachiness. Through the stories, she shows God's tender love for us all as we are and his power to redeem.
