All who are baptized in any Christian church and seek to follow Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour may receive communion.

- † To receive the bread, hold out your hands, crossed with palms up.
- † The celebrant will place the bread in your hands.
- † If you require gluten-free wafers, please indicate at the time of receiving.
- † To receive the cup, guide it to your mouth using the base.
- † If you prefer not to drink from the cup, bow slightly in reverence.
- † To receive a blessing instead, cross your arms over your chest.
- \* For specific prayer, make your way to the prayer room (SE corner of the nave) after you are served. If the door is closed, please wait on the pew.


