ADVENT

Advent is a time of expectation. We come, we cry, we watch, we wait, we look, we long for the birth of the messiah.

At the two most important times of the Christian year, Advent and Easter, we are given time. We are entering now the time of Advent, the time we get to reflect on the mystery that is the incarnation. God with us in the flesh! We are given time to reflect on ourselves as human beings and that God came as an embodied human to share in the journey of pilgrimage we call life.

In our churches we shift our focus, and place symbols to remind us that we are not in the hum-drum time. The advent wreath is the most common for us, maybe in your home or the church. They function as a focal point of prayer and the ceremonial marking of time as a new candle is lit each week, symbolizing the light coming into the world.

The First Candle - Hope

As the light of something new is coming into the world we live in hope. It is the hope professed by the prophets of old that a saviour would come.

The Second Candle - Peace

Advent reminds of living in the in-between time of already and not yet. We look forward to God's coming reign where we live peaceable lives as God intended.

The Third Candle - Joy

As Mary waits for the child growing inside of her to be born, we wait with the joy of anticipation of Christ being with us again, anew and afresh.

The Fourth Candle - Love

"God so loved the world that he sent his only son" to be with us, not distant or inaccessible, but who chose to come into our midst.

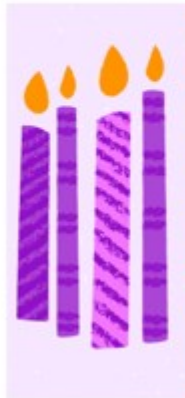
The Christ Candle - The Feast of the Incarnation

We enter now into the season of Christmas leaving Advent behind us. Course goals

On successful completion of this course, you will be able to:

1. Clearly articulate your understanding of the nature and purpose of preaching
2. Prepare and deliver a sermon appropriate to the time and place
3. Demonstrate developing confidence, and a sense of your own voice as a preacher.

Course schedule and format

The course will take place by video conference, using a single Zoom link

Thursday, November 10 6:30-8:30pm Preaching Practice I

Friday, December 2 6:30-9:30pm Class Session II

Friday, December 9 6:30-8:30pm Preaching Practice II

Friday, January 6 6:30-9:30pm Class Session III

Friday, January 13 6:30-8:30pm Preaching Practice III

Friday, February 3 6:30-9:30pm Class Session IV (Conclusion of course)

Class sessions will consist of a combination of talks from the instructor, exercises, discussion, and Q&A times. On preaching practice evenings, each participating student will deliver a “first draft” of a prepared sermon, in order to receive feedback from peers and from the instructor.
