ADVENT

Advent is a time of expectation. We come, we cry, we watch, we wait, we look, we long for the birth of the messiah.

At the two most important times of the Christian year, Advent and Easter, we are given time. We are entering now the time of Advent, the time we get to reflect on the mystery that is the incarnation. God with us in the flesh! We are given time to reflect on ourselves as human beings and that God came as an embodied human to share in the journey of pilgrimage we call life.

In our churches we shift our focus, and place symbols to remind us that we are not in the hum-drum time. The advent wreath is the most common for us, maybe in your home or the church. They function as a focal point of prayer and the ceremonial marking of time as a new candle is lit each week, symbolizing the light coming into the world.

The First Candle - Hope

As the light of something new is coming into the world we live in hope. It is the hope professed by the prophets of old that a saviour would come.

The Second Candle - Peace

Advent reminds of living in the in-between time of already and not yet. We look forward to God's coming reign where we live peaceable lives as God intended.

The Third Candle - Joy

As Mary waits for the child growing inside of her to be born, we wait with the joy of anticipation of Christ being with us again, anew and afresh.

The Fourth Candle - Love

"God so loved the world that he sent his only son" to be with us, not distant or inaccessible, but who chose to come into our midst.

The Christ Candle - The Feast of the Incarnation

That which we have longed for has arrived among us. The mystery of humanity and divinity becoming one. Glory to God in the Highest and Peace to God's people on earth. We enter now into the season of Christmas leaving Advent behind us. We celebrate for another 12 days as we gladly welcome today, and all days, your Wisdom, your Power, your Emmanuel, your Prince of Peace.

Qu'Appelle House https://quappellehouse.ca/

is located next door to the Synod office.
