Day of Solemn Prayer and Fasting
Eve of the Ascension



May 13, 2026

INTRODUCTION

It has been the practice of Christ's church from the first century to combine prayer and fasting. This was especially the case when the church was seeking wisdom and guidance from God's Spirit. This was certainly the case in Acts 13 when, after a time of fasting and prayer, members of the church in Antioch sent Paul and Barnabas off on a mission of evangelism and church planting, and they subsequently established churches "and appointed elders for them in every church, with prayer and fasting" (Acts 14:23).

In that same Spirit, we at St Aidan are setting aside Wednesday, May 13th, the eve of the Ascension, as a day of solemn prayer and fasting in order that we might continue to pay attention to the Spirit's wisdom and guidance as we prepare for the next expression of pastoral leadership in our parish.

What follows is a **suggested format** for how you might participate in the day. Please do not feel that you must engage in every practice suggested. However, you are encouraged to adopt and adapt as much as you able into your regular routines and responsibilities:

First, if fasting is not a familiar practice for you, we would recommend that you read this short article from the C.S. Lewis institute that offers some excellent historical background and practical suggestions.

Second, we offer this simple structure to guide your prayer throughout the day:

- ✦ **Prayer liturgies:** Punctuate your day with the short morning, noon, evening and compline liturgies from the Northumbria community (Aidan's "home turf") that are included in this document.
- ✦ **Short prayers:** Set an **alarm**, or other means of reminder, for each hour of the day. When the alarm goes off turn your attention to God and pray one of the shorter prayers found on the last page. Alternately, carry a **prayer rock**, **holding cross** or **prayer beads** in your pocket and—whenever your hand contacts it—offer one of those short prayers to Lord; or, when you experience **hunger**, turn your attention to God and pray.
- ✦ **Compline:** Finally, as a way of bringing our prayers together, join with us for a short Compline service at 7 pm on the 13th of May.

If this Compline is being used in a group setting the * notation indicates a change of reader; words in bold are said all together; words in bold italic are said by each person in turn; and + indicates where you might make the sign of the cross.
